## Forgiveness Scriptures

Matthew 6:14-15 After the Lord’s Prayer Jesus said, “For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.”

Matthew 8:34-35 And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. “So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses.”

The parable of the unforgiving servant will help you to understand the consequence of unforgiveness is being put into a spiritual prison, where the enemy is given a right to torment you. The torment can take on many different forms – mental, emotional, physical, and circumstantial. (See Matthew 18:21-35)
